Fleet Mechanic

What does a Fleet Mechanic do?

Primary role: A fleet mechanic will perform regular maintenance on equipment, trucks, and trailers. This generally consists of cleaning, oil changes, tire rotations and changes, mower blade changes and sharpening, plow repairs to replace broken or worn parts, salt spreader repairs, etc.

Secondary role: A fleet mechanic will be available to perform service needs during snow events to keep our fleet operational for our clients. Transporting equipment to or from job sites may be needed.

Fleet Mechanic skills and qualifications

A successful candidate will possess various skills and qualifications in order to perform their duties as a mechanic. This includes possessing a degree of knowledge in order to be a Fleet Mechanic. Some of the basic skills and qualifications a mechanic might need include:

- Ability to conduct routine services and maintenance on equipment and trucks
- Demonstrates ability to inspect equipment for faults and repairs
- Practical knowledge of vehicle and equipment diagnostics
- Ability to work well with others
- Sound problem-solving skills
- Willingness to learn new processes and skills
- Personal tools are a plus but are NOT a requirement

Fleet Mechanic salary expectations

A Fleet Mechanic will make between \$20 and \$25/hr. Salary will depend on level of experience and education. 401K match and vacation will be offered. A company service truck is also an option.

Fleet Mechanic education and training requirements

Typically, a mechanic will require a high school diploma and an associate degree in automotive technology or similar but it is not a requirement. They will be required to hold a valid state driver's license. Any mechanic skills and experience is a plus and should be noted in resume or on application.
